Dear Youth Worker:

Mid-Ohio Valley Work Camp 2010 is rapidly approaching. The camp will be held June 20-25. This is our twelfth year. This year the theme is "Serve Now" based on the scripture Galatians 5:13. This letter is to inform you of some of the details of Work Camp.

It is **IMPERATIVE** that you bring the following items:

- A 15-passenger van that can be used to transport teens to work sites;
- A trailer or pick-up truck to serve as a trailer, to transport supplies;
- A ladder for each teen to use during the week. Please try to bring a variety of ladders (6-foot step to extension);
- One adult for every five teens.

It is very important that these items and people be brought with you to help make Work Camp run more smoothly.

The registration fee this year will be **\$75** per teen and **\$25** per adult. A family discount will be given - \$50.00 per teen where there are 2 or more from one family. (There will be a \$25 late fee charge to those who do not register by the deadline.) This cost covers food, housing, lodging, banquet and a T-shirt. It is imperative that your registration information **must** be postmarked no later than **June 1** in order to be on time. This includes all registration forms, group registration form, transportation sheet, medical forms for teens and adults and payment. All forms will be available on-line at movworkcamp.org. You can also view last year's work camp from our website. Because of facilities and logistics, we can only accept **500** people, and we will cut registration off after the first 500. So, don't wait. **NOTE:** Because of the number of people wanting to come to work camp, it is **very important for you to get your registration information in as soon as possible**. Late registration is strongly discouraged and we will not be able to accommodate special requests (i.e. housing and crew re-assignments) after the registration deadline. We realize that this might be inconvenient, but we praise God that there are so many interested in coming that this step is necessary.

The following forms are enclosed and must be must be completely filled out and postmarked by June 1. If **ANY** of these forms are missing information, the late registration fee of \$25.00 **WILL** be applied.

Enclosed in this packet are the following materials:

- Teen Brochure
- Leaders' Guide
- Transportation Sheet
- A Group Registration Form
- Pair Form for Sites/Crew Assignments
- Medical Form—to be completed by teens and adults

Once we have received your registration forms, we will send you some information regarding housing, Work Camp rules, activities for the evenings, schedules, and more details that will be helpful to you and your group before you get to Work Camp.

Work Camp will end on Friday morning again this year. In the past, the banquet has marked the end of activities, but because of our desire to emphasize the spiritual aspect of Work Camp, we have decided to extend the time. This will allow us to have a closing devotional on Thursday night after the banquet. Breakfast will be served on Friday morning, and then we will work as a group to clean up the dorms and put the campus back in order. Everyone should be able to leave no later than 11:00 a.m.

Each congregation that attended work camp last year received a letter at the beginning of the year. This letter was for your eldership asking them to support work camp with a \$500.00 donation. **Please check with your elders and return your donation as soon as possible.** We need your congregation's help. Our budget for this work camp is just over \$48,000.00. This is a great undertaking. Can you please help us?

Please begin now to keep Work Camp 2010 in your prayers, praying for the safety of those traveling and also good weather for the week. **Please be sure to have all your registration information (group form, crew assignment form, transportation sheet, individual registration forms, medical forms and payment) postmarked by June 1.** May God bless you far beyond your imagination as you work diligently at one of the most important jobs in the world—influencing the lives of teens in the name of Christ.
