Looking Back on Work Camp

Below is a brief history of the beginning of Mid-Ohio Valley Work Camp along with some interesting facts about the growth and outreach.

- ✝ Mid-Ohio Valley Work Camp (MOVWC) was started by area youth ministers from the church of Christ in 1999.
- ✝ Approximately 100 young people from the Mid-Ohio Valley painted six (6) houses during the first Work Camp.
- ✝ The camp has grown consistently each year both in numbers of houses painted and numbers of participants.
- ✝ Workers, mostly teens, have come from not only the Mid-Ohio Valley states of West Virginia and Ohio but also from Connecticut, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Florida, Kentucky, and Tennessee.
- ✝ In 2007, over 500 workers together painted 41 houses in the Mid-Ohio Valley.
- ✝ To date, we have painted a total of 266 houses.
- ✝ In 2000, MOVWC was honored by then Governor Cecil Underwood of West Virginia with an award for Outstanding Service to the Community.
- ✝ On June 24, 2004, Rick Modesitt, President of The County Commission of Wood County, resolved that June 20-26, 2004 be declared Mid-Ohio Valley Work Camp Week throughout the county.
- ✝ MOVWC was honored in July with the Spirit of Wood County Award by the Wood County Commission in honor of accomplishments and community spirit demonstrated throughout this community.
- ✝ Work Camp is a non-profit organization that relies on congregational and individual contributions as well as area business to provide needed funding, food and supplies to successfully function.
- ✝ Over 75 local businesses helped with Work Camp 2007 by providing supplies, money donations and food. Many individuals and churches also donated money to help with the expenses.

Purpose	Mid-Ohio Valley Work Camp is a project organized to give young people an opportunity to serve God by serving others who are in need. This will be the eleventh annual camp. In 2008, we were able to paint 41 houses in this area.
Location	We will once again be using the campus of Ohio Valley University as our Home Base during the week. All groups will meet in the gym for breakfast and a devotional each morning before dispersing to the various sites. Lunches will be provided at local churches, and dinner will be served in the evenings back at OVU.
Sites	The houses that will be painted during the week are referred to as work sites. The tasks at hand at the sites will include scraping, painting, caulking, minor repairs, cleaning up and perhaps light yard work. Most of the houses at the sites are owned by people who are living on limited incomes or by senior citizens who cannot do the work themselves.
Safety Factor	Each site will be inspected by adults and the local electric company before Work Camp begins. First aid is available at each site. Water will be provided at each site during the day. Our policy is always safety first!
What to Bring	In addition to personal items and clothing, each worker should bring his Bible, a four-inch paintbrush and one ladder, which can be anything from a step ladder to an extension ladder. You should also bring sun screen, sunglasses and/or hat and work gloves.
Cost	The cost is \$75 per teen and \$25 per adult, which covers all expenses. All participants must fill out the registration form (see back) and the Health History Form and give them, along with payment, to the youth leader. Registrations received after the deadline will be charged a \$25 late fee per person.
Housing	All participants who attend Work Camp will be housed in the dormitory at Ohio Valley University.
